








REVOLUTION

Director **Rob Stewart** tackles the environmental issues that affect us all

ALEXANDRA HEILBRON & BONNIE LAUFER KREBS

Rob Stewart's love of sharks brought us the award-winning documentary **Sharkwater**. He recently set out on another breathtaking and dangerous adventure to create **Revolution**—an action-filled documentary that reveals surprising facts about the world we live in—and told **Tribute** about his epic journey.



■ What was it that inspired you to go on this journey?

We were at the *Sharkwater* premiere in Hong Kong but while there, it was pointed out to me that our film didn't address the size of the problem and that there was this bigger problem—an issue of human consumption.

Right after the movie premiere, I got an eye infection from all the pollution in the air. It was a bit of a turning point for me—have we really polluted the air so much that I had to have an operation because of it?

It became clear to me there's a much bigger problem and that what we were doing with sharks was just the tip of the iceberg—now we have to "save the humans."

So it was really quite simple for me. There was one movie I could make after *Sharkwater* and that was *Revolution*.

The Toronto Film Festival was a turning point for us because that was the first public screening of *Revolution* and we had no idea

whether it was going to work and whether people would actually like the movie as a journey. So in Toronto to get a standing ovation and to get some audience choice accolades was huge for us.

■ What's the message of *Revolution*?

We're consuming the animals, the trees, the birds and the bees and that's not sustainable. It's not a tiny shift in climate policy that's going to do this, like an eco-friendly car or a plastic bag ban. Although those things are important, we need to work together to get governments and corporations to change.



REVOLUTION has been screened at several film festivals and is proving to be an audience favorite. At the Santa Barbara Film Festival, *Revolution* received an introduction from Academy Award-nominated director Gus Van Sant (*Milk*, *Good Will Hunting*), who was so impressed by an early cut he saw that he became involved with *Revolution* as an Executive Producer.

■ How did you get *Revolution* made?


People worked on this movie for free and gave it every-

thing they had to see it through because they believed in the vision and believed in a better world.

We pulled together the 10 best writers and conservationists and activists that I knew and

had a writer's workshop where we discussed the environmental issues and the most important issues facing humanity.

I estimated the film could be produced for \$5 million in 3D, but when funding fell through, I realized I had to make the film on a much smaller budget.

I figured if I could just buy a couple of cameras and a backpack and a bunch of plane tickets, maybe I could go shoot this movie myself. I took the tiny bit of cash that we did have to shoot *Revolution*.

■ What can people expect to see in *Revolution*?

It was really important for us to get some of the best wildlife footage ever recorded. If we want people to pay money to see a movie, we want to show them incredible things they could not have seen anywhere else.

■ What keeps you inspired?

I'm inspired because so many people want to help. Fight for something and people will align behind you because it gives their lives meaning. So that's been a really beautiful process.

One of the most heartwarming things that happened was hearing from kids who had seen *Sharkwater* and started doing something about it. That gave me a lot of hope and helped me realize this journey we're on is a positive movement.

■ What do you want people to take away from this film?

I hope that people come away from *Revolution* with a love of life because it's life that gives us our food, our water and our air. I hope that that love helps people go to bat to fight for the ecosystems we depend on for our survival.

This month, We Day - the free, full-day educational event that began in Canada and is sweeping the world - comes to the Ottawa-Gatineau Region, inspiring a generation to act.


Bringing together some of the greatest heroes of our time, We Day addresses pressing world issues and ignites students' passion to be the change.


ased on the classic American novel by F. Scott Fitzgerald, *The Great Gatsby* was turned into a 1974 motion picture starring Robert Redford as the debonair multi-millionaire whose name has become synonymous with wealth. It won Oscars in the music and costume categories, and advance buzz says the new version is a shoe-in for another Best Costume nomination at next year's Academy Awards.

There are even higher hopes for this new version, starring Leonardo DiCaprio. He may not have the same cool exterior and easy charm that Redford exuded as Jay Gatsby, but when it comes right down to it, Gatsby is not all that he appears. Known for his versatility, Leo may in fact be the perfect choice. With several Oscar nominations and no wins to his name, this could be the role that finally gets him the trophy.

But great costumes and casting choices are not the only things that have generated advance buzz about this movie. Despite the fact

that 3D is associated mostly with action and animated movies, director Baz Luhrmann is using the new format for this drama. Leonardo explained why to *Access Hollywood*: "He really wanted to use 3D to create the emotional impact with the characters and almost use it like what it would be to immerse yourself in a theater production. Plus, it's the great American novel and the more you dig into that book the more

questions you have to ask yourself about these characters. It's like this endless mystery as to what motivated all these people and I'm having a great time with the material."

There's more than meets the eye when Tom Cruise tackles sci-fi

Tom Cruise is taken captive by Morgan Freeman in Oblivion

t 50 years of age, Tom Cruise is hotter than ever—in more ways than one. Since reprising his role as Ethan Hunt in the highly successful *Mission: Impossible – Ghost Protocol*, he's been working nonstop.

His newest motion picture to hit theaters is *Oblivion* and just like with his recent movie *Jack Reacher*, where Cruise didn't fit the description of his character in the novel but still somehow managed to pull it off, he's playing a character a little different than how he's described in the original work.

In the graphic novel *Oblivion* by Joseph Kosinski, who also directed the movie and co-wrote the screenplay, Jack Harper

(Cruise) is just 37. Despite the 13-year age difference, Cruise at 50 is in better shape than many men in their late thirties, and he's able to pull off this role to perfection. Harper is a man left on Earth after a mass evacuation due to a war that's destroyed most of the planet, but when he runs into a team of renegades, he gets a major eye-opening.

After a meeting with Kosinski about *Oblivion*, which hadn't yet been released in novel form, Cruise immediately expressed interest, saying, "Let's do this. I want to do this movie with you." The director told MTV.com: "The role fits him like a glove. I just can't imagine anyone else playing this character." **T**

Jurassic Park 3D

"An adventure 65 million years in the making"—plus 20 years

A Tyrannosaurus wreaks havoc in Jurassic Park 3D

ho says dinosaurs are extinct? The ferocious animals were brought back to life with award-winning visual effects and terrifying sounds in *Jurassic Park*, effects that were rare in 1993 when it was first released. To commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Steven Spielberg classic sci-fi film, it will be re-released in theaters in 3D, enabling audiences to join John Hammond, his small group of experts and his grandchildren on a realistic, terrifying adventure.

After a worker is killed in the theme park filled with cloned dinosaurs, experts are called in to certify its safety. A tropical storm, a renegade Tyrannosaurus rex and three Velociraptors cause chaos, leaving a trail of injured humans behind.

If the 3D release doesn't satisfy your dinosaur fill, get ready for more prehistoric action in *Jurassic Park IV*, scheduled to be released June 13, 2014.

■ What was it about *The Host* that got you on board?

Stephanie had an awful lot to do with me taking on the film. She was in London working on another film and came over to Dublin to see me to talk to me about the script and to see if I would be interested. I just found the whole concept of a body being taken over by an alien soul to rid us of all of the bad in us quite fascinating. I knew that it was going to be something I could really sink my teeth into.

■ Is it beneficial to read the books for more insight into your character?

I read the book and I am glad I did, because I was genuinely interested in finding how my character developed and where the story was going to go and if in fact I could

offer any suggestions once it came to taking on the role.

You play Melanie and also Wanda, the alien soul that inhabits her body.

It was fun playing both of these characters. There is an inner conflict going on between them, so to tackle the dialogue between Melanie and Wanda I wore an earpiece. Initially I thought it would be weird because we pre-recorded all the dialogue that Melanie hears in her head throughout the film. I actually got used to hearing myself and was able to react to it quite easily. It was still challenging but there weren't as many hurdles to jump over as I initially thought there might be.

■ Do you think that might be because the characters are so different?

Oh yes, absolutely. One is an alien

and she's sort of a perfect being. She doesn't feel any negative emotion at all, no hatred and doesn't flare up at all. Melanie is quite a spitfire. She's mouthy and she challenges people and she steals things and is always on the run. So it was quite fun getting to play two such opposite characters and it wasn't difficult separating them.

■ Was it hard to sympathize with Wanda?

No, it wasn't at all. She has

taken over Melanie's body but she doesn't know any better. Generally souls are beautiful creatures that make the world, in their eyes, a better place. I really loved her and couldn't blame her for anything that happened.

■ Did you get to do your own stunts?

Yes, I insisted on doing as much as I could myself. Also, when you are able to do your own stunts and it's not life threatening, it's so much better because it means the camera can actually stay on you and you don't have to cut away to a stunt person. It looks so much more realistic and I have to say not only is it satisfying but it's pretty exhilarating!

■ Because you're playing two girls, you get two different love interests.

I know, right? We were calling it a love square on set. Firstly, Max Irons was just lovely to work with. We got on really well and we actually knew each other before we



■ Then there is Jake Abel who plays Ian.

He's great actually and what was really wonderful about him was that he was in *The Lovely Bones* with me a few years ago, so we already had a history and a friendship. I love Jake, he is brilliant, and he made me laugh a lot and I loved hanging out with him on set.

"I'm not the kind of person who gets excited by fame"

You're Irish but you have the American accent down pat.

I grew up watching

American movies and television shows, so I'm sure that helps me when I have to play an American girl. I find it the same when I have to play Aussie or Kiwi or Scottish. I have been exposed to their cultures and people so it really helps when I have those sounds in my brain.

■ Despite achieving fame at such a young age, how do you stay so grounded?

My parents. My mum is pretty amazing, she's very grounded and has always come on set with me from the very beginning, so I think that would have an awful lot to do with that. Also, I'm Irish, I live in Ireland and I'm not the kind of person who gets excited about fame or that side of it; I just love doing what I do. I don't want to get a big head or carried away with all that sort of stuff. I just love to work and I feel so incredibly blessed that I get to meet so many new people who have enriched my life in ways I could never explain.

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

ABIGAIL BRESLIN

describes being kidnapped in *The Call*

ABIGAIL BRESLIN may be only 16 but she's been working since age three, first in commercials and then making her movie debut as Mel Gibson's daughter in Signs (2002). She was nominated for an Oscar at 10 for her performance in Little Miss Sunshine. Three years ago, she made her Broadway debut playing Helen Keller in The Miracle Worker.

■ Kidnapping has to be one of the scariest premises.

Yeah, it is. When I first read the script before I met with [director] Brad Anderson, it was such a page turner and my heart was pounding. I couldn't put it down and my initial feeling was if this gets made into a movie, it will be a pretty crazy ride to see on the big screen.

What can you tell us about the movie?

I play Casey, a teenage girl who's at the mall with her best friend and she gets kidnapped in the parking lot and is put into the trunk of this guy's car. She wakes up completely disoriented and has no idea where she is. She finds her friend's prepaid cell phone in her pocket and dials 911. The first operator who answers is a trainee and doesn't know what to do because the phone has no GPS and you can't track where the call is coming from. That's when Halle Berry's character steps in. She's a former 911 operator who is now training people and takes over the call.

■ How did you manage to stay calm being in that trunk?

They said we're going to put you in and we're going to be driving for about two minutes and then we will stop and let you out. I don't have claustrophobia so I wasn't worried about it. But when they closed the trunk, it was scary. It was pitch

black and I couldn't see anything. It totally throws you off and it is terrifying. The other thing was, I started thinking about all the things that could possibly go wrong, like what if I suffocate? What if they forget I'm in here?

■ Did you get to spend much time with Halle Berry?

No, Halle and I are barely in the same scenes together other than just being on the phone. They had it set up when I was in the trunk so I could listen to Halle talking. She would talk to me through a microphone so it was as if we really were communicating back and forth with each other. She was very sweet and so amazing to work with.

You have several movies coming up, but one big one is *Ender's Game*.

It was really fun working on that movie. I loved working with Asa Butterfield. It's fun to meet people and when they ask, "What have you been working on?" and when I say *Ender's Game*, they freak out. A lot of people love my character Valentine and they say, "I wish I had a sister like her." She's a much-loved character from the book so I hope that I did her justice to the fans out there.






